Demand for services has increased dramatically, creating an urgent need for more space and improved accessibility at the Penticton Youth Centre.

Just within the last year:

- 900+ youth accessed 5,000+ services at the Foundry, a 58% increase in demand.
- 200+ youth and families accessed ARC Programs -- ranging from intervention to treatment and rehabilitation.
- 45% of youth clients responded in a survey that if the Centre was unavailable, they wouldn't have received the help they needed, or known where to go to seek help.
